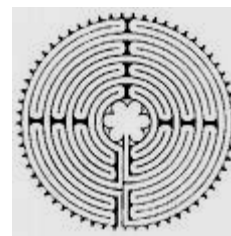
What do we do on the local level?

Lyttleton Street UMW currently has seven Circles made up of groups of women in the church - young and old, working and retired, kids and no kids. We meet once a month from September through May. Circle meetings are normally structured to include a social/refreshment time, a devotion, a program and to conduct UMW business.

Many Circle members take turns hosting, sharing a devotion and presenting a short program. Meetings may run between 1 to 2 hours depending on the schedule of events.
